

Coordinated by teacher Stephanie Nash, the students rotated through, grade by grade, to explore the various demonstration items until every students had visited the bus.

Requirements for registration
include a birth certificate; a school
entry health exam performed

include abirth certificate; a school entry health exam performed within 12 months prior to the first day of school; a required immunization certification; and proof of residency, including rental agreement or mortgage documents plus a utility statement. A photo ID or driver's license of the parent/guardian and the voluntary collection of the child's Social Security card — which may be used for specific purposes including specific purposes including Medicaid eligibility and billing, scholarship applications, state assessments and driver's licenses
